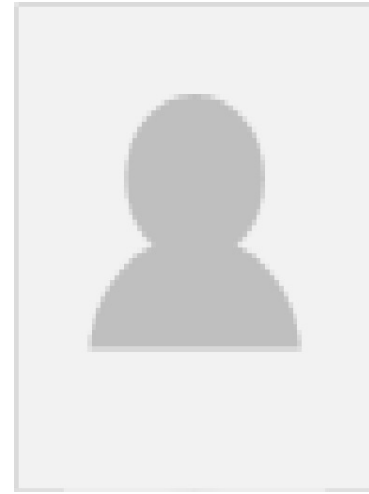

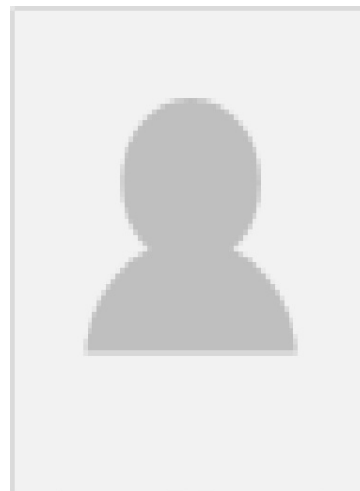

Please note that “near the passing standard” does not imply that you performed “at or above” the standard, only that you performed in proximity to the passing standard. Additionally, a pass-fail decision is not calculated by adding your performance across the content areas. For instance, you could fall into the ‘Near the passing standard’ on all the areas, but they could have all been ‘near’ and below the passing standard.

| Reduction of Risk Potential: Reduces the potential for clients to develop complications or health problems related to treatments, procedures or existing conditions. | BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD |
| Physiological Adaptation: Participates in providing care for clients with acute, chronic or life-threatening physical health conditions. | BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD |
| Clinical Judgment: The observed outcome of critical thinking and decision-making. It is an iterative process that uses nursing knowledge to observe and assess presenting situations, identify a prioritized client concern, and generate the best possible evidence-based solution in order to deliver safe client care. | BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD |
| Recognize Cues: Identify relevant and important information from different sources (e.g., medical history, vital signs). | BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD |
| Analyze Cues: Organizing and linking the recognized cues to the client's clinical presentation. | BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD |
| Prioritize Hypotheses: Evaluating and ranking hypotheses according to priority (urgency, likelihood, risk, difficulty, time, etc.). | BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD |
| Generate Solutions: Identifying expected outcomes and using hypotheses to define a set of interventions for the expected outcomes. | BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD |
