Pharmacological and Parenteral Therapies:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

Provides care related to the administration of medications and parenteral therapies.

Reduction of Risk Potential:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

Reduces the likelihood that clients will develop complications or health problems related to existing conditions, treatments or procedures.

Physiological Adaptation:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

Manages and provides care for clients with acute, chronic or life-threatening physical health conditions.

Clinical Judgment:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

The observed outcome of critical thinking and decision-making. It is an iterative process that uses nursing knowledge to observe and assess presenting situations, identify a prioritized client concern, and generate the best possible evidence-based solution in order to deliver safe client care.

Recognize Cues:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

Identify relevant and important information from different sources (e.g., medical history, vital signs).

Analyze Cues:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

Organizing and linking the recognized cues to the client's clinical presentation.

Prioritize Hypotheses:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

Evaluating and ranking hypotheses according to priority (urgency, likelihood, risk, difficulty, time, etc.).

Generate Solutions:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

Identifying expected outcomes and using hypotheses to define a set of interventions for the expected outcomes.

Take Actions:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

Implementing the solution(s) that address(es) the highest priorities.

Evaluate Outcomes:

BELOW THE PASSING STANDARD

Comparing observed outcomes against expected outcomes.
